


Anthony Kipling of Bishopton – Excise Officer

Anthony Kipling, s of Anthony Kipling, b Little Stainton, Bishopton, Durham 6 Jun 1745.¹

Anthony married Mary Atkinson at Bishopton in 1770. They had children there (Elizabeth 1771(d 1771) and John 1772).


Anthony Kipling Excise officer of Welburn and wife Elizabeth (sic) had daughter Elizabeth baptised at Bulmer b1775.




1777 Mary & Charlotte twin daurs of Anthony Kiplin, exciseman bapd June 4th

¹ Anthony was the son of Anthony Kipling who married Mary Melanbe at Bishopton in 1744. They also had children Easter (1746) and Elizabeth (1749). Anthony sen. died in 1764. Anthony senior's antecedents are not known.

Anthony Kipling of Manchester, Officer of Excise, Widower, & Esther Watson of Witham, Widow, married by Licence January 6th 1781.

Deaths & Burials in 1781, continued.

Esther, the Wife of Anthony Kipling, Officer of Excise, from Manchester died the 21st & buried Augth 26th.

Anthony remarried in Manchester the following year.

The Eighth Day of May in the Year of our LORD One Thousand Seven Hundred and Eighty Two.

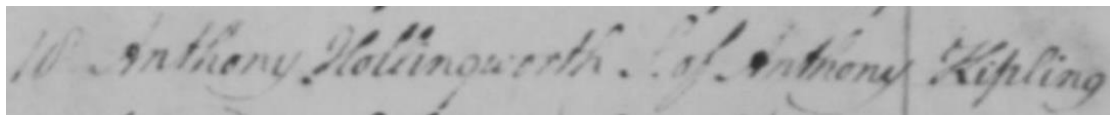

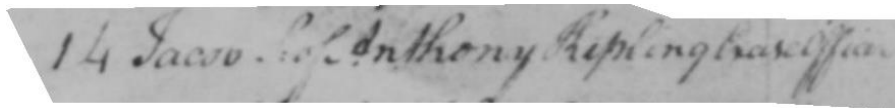

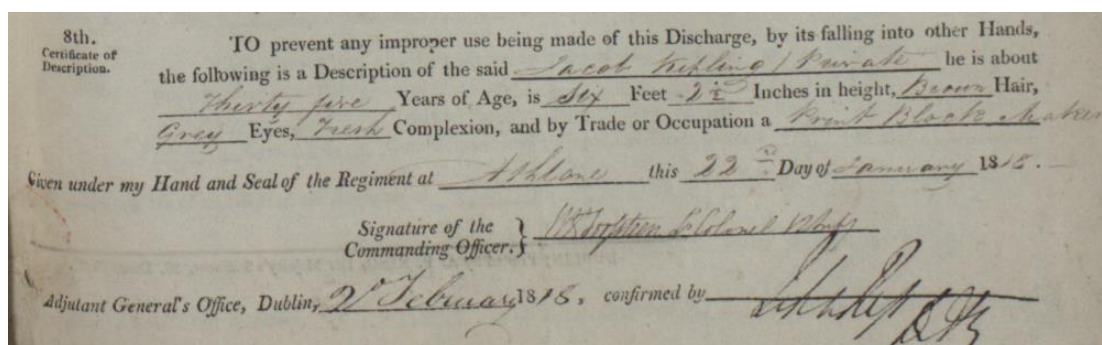
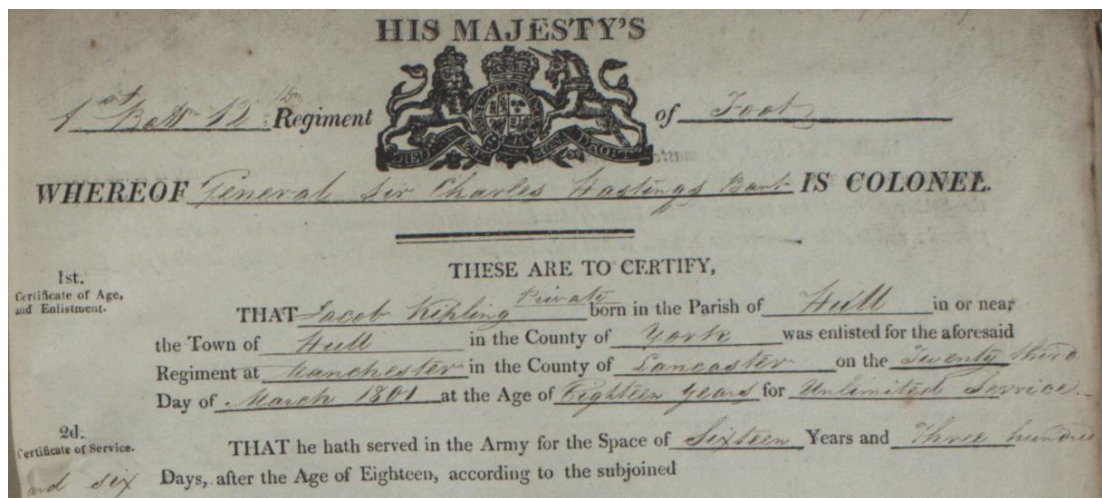
To the Conductor of the Lever-street Dispensary.
In the month of May, I was obliged to leave my employment, being seized with the dropsy, in its most violent stage;

Son **Jacob** probably served as a soldier for 17 years from 1801 (he was probably only 16 when he joined up).



Jacob died in Manchester in 1825.

Also in Bishopton, Arthur Kipling married Easter Tomson in 1694 and had children William (8 Apr 1696), John (30 Jan 1696, d 1716), Mary (1698), Peter (1699), George (1701, d1701) and Arthur (1704). One of the Arthurs died in 1724 and the other in 1749. Easter died in 1728. Peter married Jane Reed at Sadberge in 1724.

Samuel Kipling had married Ann Emmerson at Coniscliffe in 1634 and had a son George there in 1638. Samuel signed the 1641 protestation return at Heighington, paid

the 1666 Hearth Tax at Archdeacon Newton, was reported by Dean Granville in 1675 at Bishopton for “not resorting to church” and was buried at Bishopton in 1679. George married Mary Westwood at Bishopston in 1675 and they had children Ann (1678) and Mary (1682, Little Stainton).

Also, a Robert Kipling of Bishopton had children Robert (1677) and Jane (1681). Was he the Robert Kipling below?

An Elizabeth Kipling died at B'ton in 1692 and a Susannah Kipling married a John Truefoot of Kirkleatham at Bishopton in 1747.

A John Kipling was witness to two marriages at Bishopton in 1761-62.
