

## David 1911

Three households in the 1911 census were children of John Kipling born Stockton 1830, the descendant of three generations of David Kiplings, the earliest of whom was described in the 1800s as being from "near Boroughbridge".





Lythe Charles Son of David Kipling — Labr. Aged 8 Weeks — — 12<sup>th</sup> Nov 1796


Their second, David, was born in Lythe in 1798.

Labr. Born Jan 19 1798 Bapt Church 3



Their next two children were born in Kirkby Moorside; John in 1801 and Bridget in 1803. David is described as son of David [Kipling] of "near Boroughbridge" and Jane as the daughter of John and Bridget Wrightson of Norton near Malton.

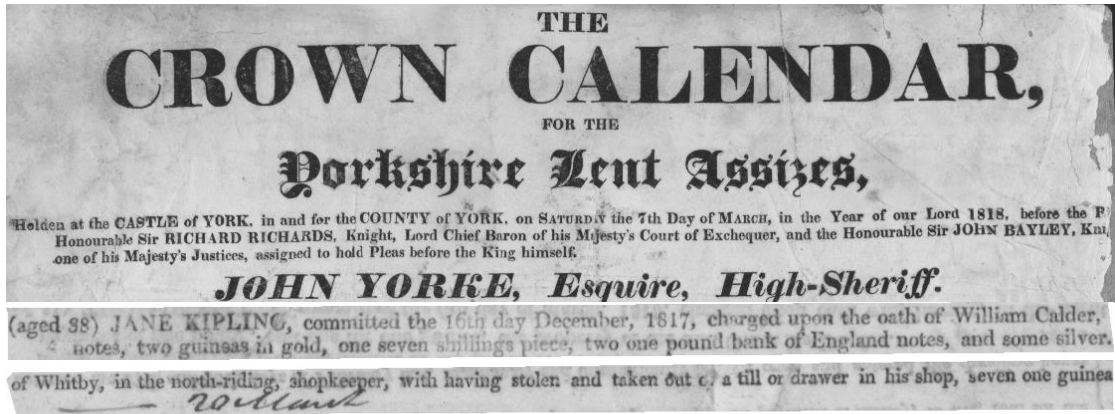

She was sentenced to two years' hard labour.

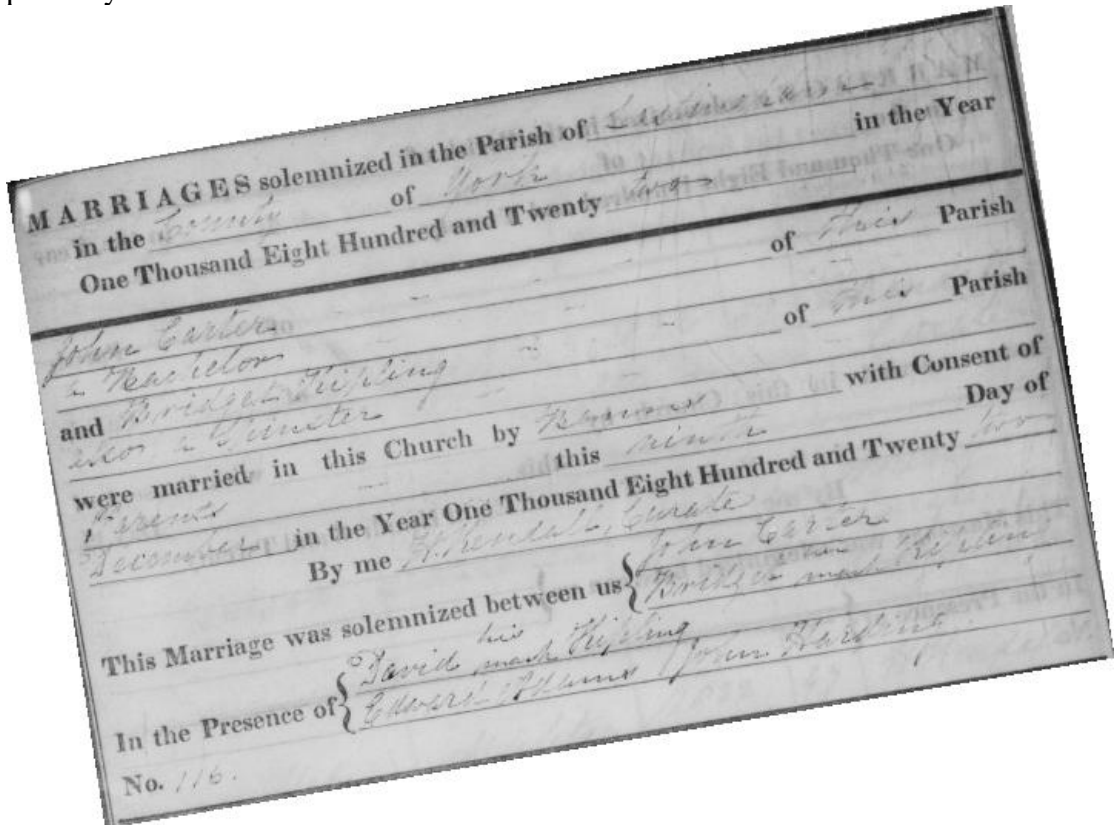

Jane died in Stockton in 1863, aged 89.

Meanwhile, son David (described as a sailor) had married widow Rebecca Robson in Whitby in 1823. In 1825 he is recorded in connection with a mortgage at Whitby. David and Rebecca had children David (bpt. 1824 at Whitby) and Rebecca (1825) and Martha (1827) both at Robin Hood's Bay.

The family are recorded as being forcibly moved from Fylingdales to Whitby in 1830, following a previous attempt to move them to Rosedale and an order on David to maintain them in 1829.

Smith's Pottery, was playing, when he upset a wheel, which threw him backward with such force against a part of the engine, and inflicted so severe a wound on his head and neck, as to cause death in a short time.

**UNFOUNDED CHARGE.**—Rebecca Kipling charged Michael Braithwaite with stealing an umbrella on the 19th October. It was alleged that the defendant went into John-street and accosted the complainant, asking where so and so one lived. She enquired and then told the man, who afterwards asked her to go on an errand, and volunteered to hold her umbrella whilst she went. When she returned the man and the umbrella were gone. She could not positively swear to the accused. Case dismissed.

Electric main tapping has taken place at Birtley, and several men were fined yesterday at Chester-le-Street. Harry Kipling, of Buchanan Terrace, was sent to prison for 28 days. He was described as 'the ringleader.'

As far as I can tell, there are now no living male heirs of either brother, hence of any of the **David** family group.

Finally, a Thomas Kipling, son to John and Jane Kipling, is reported as being born at Kirkby Moorside in 1827, possibly the son of David senior's other son **John**. It's possible that they moved to Hull, as a Thomas Kipling of about the right age died there in 1832.
