PITCH AND TOSS.

Daniel Williams and Thomas Allison were charged with having been playing at pitch and toss in Albert-street, Millfield, on Sunday last. They were fined 2s 6d each and costs.—Joseph Lindsay and Joseph Kipling were charged with a similar offence on the 21st inst. in Bank-street, Sunderland. They were fined in the costs.

Sunderland Daily Echo and Shipping Gazette - Wednesday 30 June 1880

Elizabeth Wolds and Martha Kipling were summoned by Eliza Bartley for assaulting her. Complainant said that on Saturday night she was returning home with a parcel of groceries, and when near her own door the prisoners stopped her, one of them striking her a blow in the face with a key, which caused it to bleed freely. She had given them no provocation. An old woman named Martin said the defendants had waited for complainant coming home. Kipling was fined 5s and costs, and Wolds was discharged.—

John Kipling, grocer, was charged with having a pair of unjust scales, which were 7 drams against the purchaser. It appeared that there was a piece of bacon stuck on the under part of the scale.—Defendant contended that it had got there accidentally.—He was ordered to pay the costs of the Court.

FAILURE OF A MONKWEARMOUTH PROVISION DEALER.—A creditors' petition has been filed in the estate of John Kipling, grocer and provision dealer, 116, Church-street, Monkwearmouth. Mr J. A. Longden has been appointed receiver, and the public examination of the debtor has been fixed for the 20th inst.

Re JOHN KIPLING, GROCER, MONKWEARMOUTH.
The Official Receiver applied for a further adjournment, as the bankrupt had not yet furnished a deficiency account.—In answer to Mr Brown, of Newcastle, who appeared for the trustee, the debtor stated that the property in which he had carried on business was conveyed to him on condition that he allowed his parents 15s per week, and in case of one of them dying, 10s to the survivor during his or her lifetime. He had made fifty payments, and a distress had been put in. He had not suggested to his father that he should put in a distress. He believed his brother George had suggested that. The examination was adjourned for a fortnight.

THREATENING A MOTHER-IN-LAW.
Richard Kipling was charged with threatening to murder Sarah Noble.—Mrs. Noble said the defendant was her daughter's husband, and she took him into the house, and he had threatened to murder her. Defendant was a joiner, but had not worked for three weeks. Every now and then she and her children had to run out in consequence of his conduct. He would not go out of the house.—The Mayor: Is it your house?—Complainant: Yes.—The Mayor: Turn him out and keep him out.—Defendant was ordered to find two sureties of £10 each, and to be bound himself, to keep the peace for six months.
