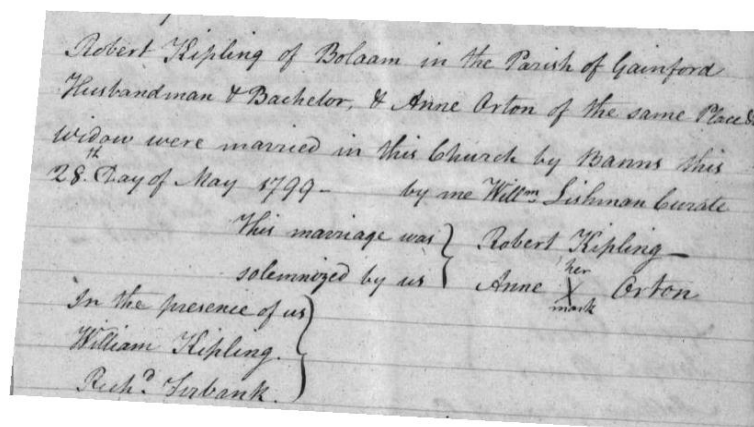


## Staindrop (Bolam) 1911

In 1799, Robert married widow Anne Orton in Gainford. Anne's maiden name was Kipling, although she was only distantly related to Robert (see [Bolam 1911](#)).



The witness William was probably Anne's brother William.

Coincidentally, and confusingly, there was another Robert and Ann Kipling in Gainford parish at the time. Also, there is an apparent record of another marriage of Robert which seems contradictory. See Appendix for details of both.

Robert and Ann had their first child in 1800, who died when nearly 4.

They also had children John (1803), Henry (1807) and Ann (1809).

Meanwhile, Anne's son from her first marriage, Thomas Orton, married Ann Snowden at Gainford in 1818 and at the time of the baptism of their second child (1823) he was known as Thomas Kipling. In 1825 he was known as "Horton or Kipling", in 1827 as "Horton", in 1830 as "Orton" and in 1832 again as "Kipling or Orton [Horton]". The family are all described as Orton in the 1841 and 1851 censuses. This suggests there was overlapping use of his father's and step-father's names.

Anne probably died in 1836 (the age given, 68, is not quite correct).

He was born 1777, so would only have been 73 or 74 in 1851, rather than 80. But he, or whoever filled in the census, may not have known his true age and simply estimated.

Daughter Anne was living next door, with her niece Elizabeth (daughter of her brother John). Robert may have died in 1855. Anne continued to live in Bolam.

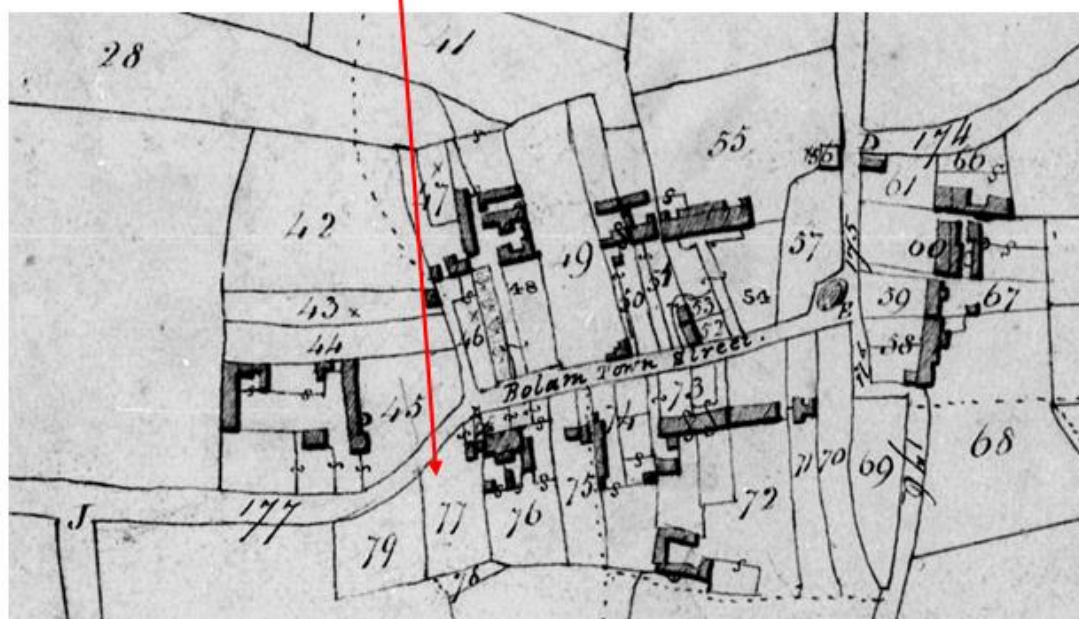

Priscilla was the daughter of Robert and Rhoda, bpt at Auckland St Andrew in 1853. A second daughter, Eveline (not "Albania"), was born there in 1854. Peggy is Robert's mother-in-law Margaret Siddle, as the 1860 US census shows. Ann Toll, who accompanied them, and also witnessed the wedding, was the wife of Durham coal miner Francis ('Frank') Toll who had gone to the US the previous year and who had presumably found a job in Muhlenberg. At that time, an iron foundry was being established in Airdrie and a patternmaker like Robert would have found employment there<sup>2</sup>.

**SHOCKING CIRCUMSTANCE.**—An inquest was held Bolam, on the 25th inst., before W. Trotter, Esq., on the body of George Kipling, a youth of 14 years of age. On the 11th of January last, the deceased had some words with his mother. He went out of the house, and though every enquiry was made for him, no trace of him could be found. On the morning of the 24th inst., his father (who lives at Bolam) happened to be looking into a quarry-hole, near Bolam, which was full of water, and frozen over; when he thought he saw something black under the ice, and on his pulling it out of the water it proved to be the body of his son much decomposed. The jury returned a verdict of "Found drowned."

**A SERIOUS CHARGE NOT PROVED.—**To-day, before the Auckland Bench, John Oliver and Matthew Kipling, putter boys, were charged with a breach of the Mines Regulation Act in Lessingthorne Colliery on the 2nd inst. Mr Labron prosecuted on behalf of Messrs Bolckow, Vaughan, and Co., and Mr Teale defended.—Mr Neesham, an overman employed at the colliery, described the danger accruing from the alleged wilful act of the defendants—viz., drawing the timber, a thing they had no right to do. They not only endangered their own lives but also the lives of others.—Three putter boys were called, but they denied any knowledge of the defendant's guilt.—The Chairman said if the charge had been proved it would have been his duty to have inflicted the largest possible penalty, as it was a most malignant act. As it was, the charge was not proved, and the case would be dismissed.




Sep: 29 Robert son of James Kipling of Gainford






