



Startforth

The first Kipling reference to this parish, which is just across the river Tees from Barnard Castle (although in Yorkshire, whilst the latter is in Durham), is the record of the burial of **Henry Kipling** in 1672.




In 1673, a **Margaret Kipling** was noted as being “discharged per legall cert” from paying tax on one hearth. She may have been Henry’s widow. There were no other Kiplings listed as paying the hearth tax at Startforth that year.

In 1678, Toby Kipling (prob. of Baldersdale) was listed as a debtor of Isabel Hutchinson.




Family of Thomas Kipling

In 1747, there was a further property transaction (possibly a sale) involving what appears to be the same property (q.v. tenants' names). The Robert Kipling referred to would have been his nephew (his brother being dead by then).

In 1771, Robert's premises were affected by a flood.

Great Flood in the River Tees in 1771.—
In November of the year 1771, there was a flood of great magnitude in the River Tees, which did immense damage along the banks of the stream, and which is still held as one of the memorable events of the district. **Barnard Castle** was seriously visited. On Saturday, the 16th of November, the water had attained an unusual height, and the people in the lower part of the town commenced to remove the goods from their houses; but not in time to escape the ravages of the swollen river, for, towards evening, the retaining walls of the bridge, on the Startforth side, were washed down, and the water at once poured into the street with irresistible force.

The other sufferers, through loss of furniture, &c., were Charles Raine, William Raine, John Monkhouse, James Alderson, Christopher Longstaff, and Robert Kipling, in amounts varying from £15 to £1 10s. each.

She is recorded paying tax in 1802 and 1803 but not in 1810. However, she may well have lived until 1820, when a Mary Kipling was buried at BC, aged 90.






